

Founder and CEO **Dr. Sanjay Kapur**, an entrepreneurial executive, scientist, speaker, anti-aging expert

and educator, recalls when he first had the vision over 25 years ago of changing the practice of medicine. The individual is placed in the driver's seat of health and wellness through better and smarter diagnostic tools and access to advanced research. "When I first came to the US nearly 3 decades ago armed only with this big vision, my PhD and \$200, I was driven to make this vision a reality," shares Dr. Kapur. He had lost both parents through medical mistakes, and was bothered by how much money is spent on medicines and medical research yet chronic diseases keep increasing. "We come in by providing easy and convenient diagnostic tools." Dr. Sonia Kapur, Sanjay's wife, is the COO and Laboratory Director. According to Sanjay, "she is the brains behind all the technologies we use in the lab and is a great leader and role model for the lab staff."

WorkSource Oregon's partnership with AYUMETRIX began in April 2016, when Dr. Kapur was introduced to **Marem Flores**, Regional Business Specialist for HealthCare, by Steve Thompson, the VP for Business Development of Automation Solutions. Steve had met Dr. Kapur at an Oregon Biosciences Association event, heard about his challenges as an emerging company, and immediately thought of connecting him with WorkSource for his hiring and training needs. Marem then met with Dr. Kapur at his Tigard office, toured the laboratory, and discussed his staffing needs, including how OJT could help with training new hires. Since that meeting, Dr. Kapur has added 2 full-time research scientists to his team. Dr. Kapur's advice to his fellow employer-entrepreneurs: "We need to recognize that everybody brings special expertise. Our duty is to recognize everyone's potential and utilize their skills not just to advance the company but to help each employee grow his/her career. At AYUMETRIX, employees are like family; this is their company and we are responsible for one another."

The Biopsychosocial aspects of aging:


Biology

- -relates to the types of physical diseases one can encounter in the aging process, some of which are generic and some of which are due to lifestyle
- -knowledge and willingness to get health assessments and to make healthy changes may contribute to longevity

Psychological aspects of aging

-these includes memory loss, illness, and disease that can contribute to the significant

rise in depression among older adults



-it is important to determine if a medical condition or medication can be contributing to the depression for which a doctor or medical team can perform a complete assessment and recommend a treatment plan
